The Committee performs a very important function in setting the direction our U3A will take and we thank them all for volunteering.

Creswick U3A hosted the **Grampians Regional Conference** on October 24th 2011 at the Tangled Maze. The Guest Speaker was Jodie Ryan from VMIA (Victorian Managed Insurance Agency) The VMIA is a statutory authority set up in 1996 to protect over \$100 billion in assets belonging to the state of Victoria. It reports to the Minister of Finance, is State Guaranteed and funded by the Department of Human Services. We were pleasantly surprised at the cover afforded to Creswick U3A through our policy which provides a range of general insurances, for example, Tutors are covered while conducting classes, even in their own home. Volunteers for the group are also covered. Members are covered for Public liability in the event of personal or property damage arising out of negligence on the part of U3A while participating in an officially sanctioned U3A activity. These are some of the benefits of belonging to the U3A NETWORK which has the ear of Government.
